

Protocols Q&A - Frequently Asked Questions Part 2

1. Q - Are temperature checks still required for guests and staff?
A - No, this is no longer a requirement nor are the logs of information required to be submitted to the Ministry.
2. Q - With the no testing requirement required for guests to return to our source markets, do we still need to retain a room stock for positive cases?
A - The room stock is required for guests who are symptomatic and test positive.
3. Q - Since temperature checks are no longer required, is there still a qualifying need to have the medical stations?
A - Medical stations are still required, as guests may fall sick during vacation stay. Access to an on call Doctor/Nurse should be maintained.
4. Q - Can unvaccinated local residents access hotels and their facilities eg: restaurants, gyms, spa facilities?
A - Yes, local residents can access hotel establishments.
5. Q - If local residents can visit all establishments, is there still a need to request proof of vaccination cards.
A - Vaccination cards are no longer required to be presented.
6. Q - Will the mask mandate become discretionary?
A - No. Mask use is still important at this time.
7. Q - Are the Perspex separators still required on the front desk?
A - These can be removed.
8. Q - Are there any plans to review the need to repeatedly sanitize?
A - Sanitation is critical at this point as other public health measures are reduced.
9. Q - The restrictions on unvaccinated guests to move freely once they have provided a negative PCR test on arrival is proving prohibitive. Can these restrictions be removed.
A - Unvaccinated guests no longer need to quarantine on arrival. They must arrive with a PCR test taken within 5 days.

10 Q - Is there still a requirement for the wearing of wristbands?

A - Wristbands are no longer required.

11 Q - Do the sites and attractions still require isolation rooms?

A - These isolation rooms are no longer required, however a space should be maintained for isolation of possible symptomatic cases at the institution.
